This call is aimed at involving organisations chairing national and international events, congress, workshops, symposia, etc. in the 4th

edition of DigitalHeritage World Congress & Expo (DH25) - https://digitalheritage2025.unisi.it/



The Organizing Committee invites you to Siena (Italy) on September 9-12, 2025, in the historical location of the University. The event will be preceded by tutorials, policy meetings and technical workshops on Monday, Sep. 8, and by field trips on Saturday Sept. 13.

DH is recognized as the most important conference dedicated federated to advancement of theory and practice within the digital cultural heritage environment. DH brings together the leading international scientific events and associations in the field of digital heritage to discuss new research results,

perspectives on future developments, and innovative applications relevant to decision making. The 4th DH will feature contributed and invited papers, workshops, roundtables, tutorial sessions and exhibitions.

DH 2025 takes place in Siena (Tuscany, Italy), one of the most important cities in mediaeval Europe. Throughout the centuries, its inhabitants preserved the city's Gothic appearance, acquired between the 12<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> centuries. The whole city of Siena, with its iconic Piazza del Campo, was devised as a work of art that blends into the surrounding landscape.



The location will host multiple parallel sessions, in rooms of different dimensions (from 20 up to 650 people) and a scientific exhibition spread

over more than 500 m2. Streaming service will be available in main rooms, for hybrid participation of special sessions, invited speakers or high level presentations.

# Appendix: Background

# 2013-2018 editions

In 2013 the first DigitalHeritage International Congress was held in Marseille, France, followed by a second edition 2015 in Granada and a third edition 2018 in San Francisco. A federated initiative of multiple leading organisations and societies, it was an unprecedented success, defining a new scientific domain, and bringing more than 600 researchers and 6000 public attendees together to see and experience cutting-edge exhibits, hear innovative research papers, debate with colleagues in symposia, and learn from leading practitioners in tutorials.

DigitalHeritage Congress was held under the auspices of UNESCO and is a federated event. It has federated in its 3 editions the following conferences and it is open possibly to new events: GCH Eurographics Symposia on Graphics and Cultural Heritage, UNESCO Memory of the World Conferences, VSMM Society Conferences. Special activities included: ACA Association of Canadian Archivists Special Session on Archives, ArcheoVirtual Expositions, Arqueologica International Meetings, CAA Symposia, CalParks Special Session on 3D Digital Preservation & Best Practices, Space2Place Symposia, ICIP ICOMOS Heritage Interpretation Panels, CIPA ICOMOS Heritage Documentation Workshops, PNC Pacific Neighborhood Consortium Conference & Joint Meetings, 2+3D Photography Special Session by Rijksmuseum, EU project meetings.

The event is characterised by a core scientific congress organised around technological tracks and heritage themes; a main **scientific expo**, where best applications in the field are presented, selected by the congress program committee. The expo is not only open and accessible to the conference attendees but also to the general public; satellite scientific events (tutorials, workshops, special sessions); a poster session organised as fast track or any other advanced multimedia format; a **commercial exhibition**, where companies and institutions could rent a space; a main scientific publication, double blind in Open Access, and other publications as special issues in academic journals recognised by the community; **awards**.
